Counting Dice

Dice are very simple toys used in board games for children. A die has six faces, each with a different number of dots from 1 to 6. Dice can be used as powerful educational tools to teach children how to count and recognize numbers effectively.

Greater Than // Lower Than

- Roll a die each. Ask the child who had the highest number and who had the lowest. The person with the highest wins!

Highest to Lowest

- Roll a number of dice. Then take turns arranging each die from highest to lowest.

Match the Numbers

- Roll a regular die and a die with numbers. Take turns where you and then your child matches the regular die with the one with digits.

Group Numbers

- Use several dice with both dots and digits. Take turns rolling all of them and then grouping the same numbers with each other.





Hopscotch

A favourite with children of all ages, hopscotch is a game that can be played inside or out. If inside, use painters' tape on the floor to pattern your own board and use buttons, rolled up socks or bean bags instead of rocks. Outside, use chalk to make a court and use rocks or the chalk itself as a marker.

- Make hopscotch tiles with numbers marked in ascending order on them. Call out a number and ask your child to jump to reach the square with the number called out to them.
